Goodwill® to open new location on Hurstbourne Parkway *Donation and retail center will be non-profit's tenth in Louisville*

Louisville, Ky. — Goodwill Industries of Kentucky plans to open its tenth donation and retail center in Louisville at 133 South Hurstbourne Parkway. The center will be housed in the former Piccadilly Cafeteria just south of Shelbyville Road.

The building, which is slightly more than 12,000 square feet, will include a donation processing area and sales floor. A donation drive-thru will be located at the side of the building. The center will create 16 new jobs with an emphasis on Goodwill's mission of employing people who have disabilities or face other barriers to obtaining work.

"We've found that convenience is very important to our donors and shoppers, and this location will make Goodwill readily accessible to people in the Hurstbourne Parkway corridor and surrounding neighborhoods," said Dr. Marsha Berry, Vice President of the Beargrass Division for Goodwill Industries of Kentucky. "Their donations will create revenue to help Goodwill continue its work in providing employment counseling, adult education, and job training to Kentuckians with disabilities or other disadvantages."

Goodwill closed on the property in early January. After renovations and remodeling, the center is expected to open before the end of 2010.
